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## From The Director

Do you have renters insurance? Is renters insurance worth it? When you live in an apartment building with multiple units, it doesn't matter how careful you are—accidents may happen to you or your neighbors. If you actually sit back and calculate the cost of replacing everything you own due to an accident, it can add up quick. Choosing to live without renters insurance may end up not being a wise financial decision.

Renters insurance provides financial protection against loss or destruction against your possessions when you rent an apartment. According to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC), the average premium only costs \$187 a year, or between \$15 and \$30 per month. Oakleaf Village has insurance policies covering structural damage to the building, but this coverage does not apply to your belonging. It also will not protect you from being liable for accidental damage caused by you or one of your guests. In addition to liability protection and reimbursement for stolen property, renter's insurance provides a coverage for damage caused by fire, lighting, smoke, windstorms, hail and vandalism. Renter's insurance also will cover your living expenses if you have to relocate during repairs.

How do you choose an insurance company? All of the best renters insurance companies provide access to four types of basis coverage: Personal Property coverage, Liability coverage, Medical payments to others, and additional living expense/loss of use. You will most likely want to compare the insurance companies to three factors: policy management, coverage, and cost.

Also, remember, you may qualify for a number of discounts. Many companies will reduce your premium if you have a fire alarm, burglar alarm, deadbolts on exterior doors, and/or sprinkler system. Many of the features you live with at Oakleaf Village.

I hope this information was helpful as to why investing in renter's insurance would be a benefit to our residents.
